Documents Stay Under Court Seal

Secret documents in the case brought by Watergate Special Prosecutor Leon Jaworski against President Nixon remained under seal at the Supreme Court yesterday despite requests by Jaworski and White House counsel that the material be made public.

There was no word when the court would release the documents, which include Jaworski's statement in a lower court that President Nixon was named as an unindicted co-conspirator by the grand jury that returned a Watergate cover-up indictment March 1.

Jaworski's motion to unseal the records was joined by James D. St. Clair, the President's lawyer, but was opposed by John M. Bray, attorney for former White House aide Gordon Strachan, one of the defendants.
