A Quiet Day for Nixon in Salzburg

Salzburg, Austria.

President Nixon spent a quiet, restful day here yesterday in preparation for his Middle East tour that starts upon his arrival in Cairo this afternoon.

Mr. Nixon and Secretary of State Henry Kissinger met with Austria's Chancellor Bruno Kreisky and Foreign Minister Rudolf Kirchschläger for one hour and 40 minutes in the baroque Klesheim castle on the outskirts of Salzburg, where the President is making a 36-hour stopover en route from Washington to Cairo.

White House press secretary Ronald Ziegler said the four men discussed European matters, East-West relations and the Middle East.

This afternoon Mr. Nixon will have his first meeting, with President Anwar Sadat of Egypt. It will be followed by a state dinner given by Sadat.

Ziegler said the presiden-

tial party will travel by train from Cairo to Alexandria and spend a day and night in the seaport city before returning to Cairo for the final meeting between the two presidents. He said

Mr. Nixon will give a dinner in Sadat's honor in Alexandria tomorrow.

The President will conclude the trip with meetings with King Hussein in Jordan

next Monday and Tuesday and spend a night at Ja's Air Force Base in the Azores on the return to Washington.
