An Egyptian belly dancer gave President Nixon a close-up demonstration at an official dinner party last night given by Egyptian President Anwar Sadat.

The dancer, Souhair Zaki, ran her fingers through Secretary of State Henry Kissinger's hair as she put on her twirling performance and gave impromptu kisses to Pat Nixon and Sadat's wife, Ghina.

Mr. Nixon, seated in the front row, applauded the dancer after she came down from the stage to dance close to him. Mrs. Nixon did not appear quite so amused.

Kissinger found an ac-

quaintance in the show. She was Nagwa Fouad, a belly dancer who was photographed in an Iranian night club with Kissinger during one of his trips to the Middle East.

At the end of the entertainment, which also included Egyptian folk music and dancing, Mr. Nixon and Sadat went on stage to shake hands with the performers. Mr. Nixon turned to have his picture taken with the cast and the excited members of the troupe came from all sides to sit in front of him and get in the photo.

Security men rushed in to get the two presidents out of the crowd.
