

Suit Over Government Wiretap

Washington

A former National Security Council staff member filed suit yesterday against President Nixon, Secretary of State Henry Kissinger and the telephone company, saying his phone was unconstitutionally tapped.

William A. K. Lake, a special assistant to Kissinger, filed the suit in U.S. District Court.

The suit asked for judgments of \$100 a day, apparently during the time he was on the phones; \$1 from each of the defendants' personal funds, and for the court to determine other damages.
