Humphrey Returns Gem Given to His Wife

Senator Hubert H. Humphrey turned over to the State Department yesterday an eight-carat diamond given to his wife by President Joseph Mobutu of the Congo, in 1968, the senator's office confirmed.

A spokesman for Humphrey said the diamond was flown in from Minneapolis to Washington and picked up at Humphrey's office yester-day afternoon to be turned to the Protocol Office.

The action follows a series of recent reports of gifts to government officials from foreign governments.

The gifts are the property

of the government under provisions of the Foreign Gifts and Decorations Act.

In a statement issued by his office, Humphrey said that he did not realize that the act covered members of his family.

Humphrey said that on all trips he was accompanied by a State Department protocol officer and was never told gifts should be placed in the custody of the government.

A Humphrey spokesman said the gifts were catalogued by the State Department in 1968, but then were returned to Humphrey.
