## All-Israeli Menu for Nixon Meal

President Nixon dined last night on all-Israeli food, ranging from trout raised in the headwaters of the River Jordan to melon grown on a kibbutz.

The melon, from Haogen kibbutz near Haifa, was the appetizer. It was followed by baked trout in almonds. The trout was raised in the Dan river, one of the three streams that feed the Biblical Jordan.

The main course was baked beef filet with potatoes, carrots and brussel sprouts.

Dessert was chocolate mousse, followed by coffee and cakes.

The meal was accompanied by Israeli wines — a dry vintage, a red cabernet and a champagne called "Sparkling President's Wine."

The banquet, hosted by Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin, was held at the Knesset, Israel's parliament.

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
