ANNAPOLIS (AP)—Former Vice President Spiro T. Agnew has moved his family into a new \$150,000 home near Maryland's capital city.

In March, Agnew sold the Kensington home, where he lived while serving as Vice President. He bought the house near Annapolis, still under construction at the time, a few days later.

The new house is a two-story, split-level brick and frame house on a secluded lot in a development a few miles north of Annapolis.

It is smaller than the Kenwood house, but provides considerable privacy, since it located at the end of a long driveway on a heavily-wooded lot and is not visible from either the road or surrounding houses.

The Agnews began moving in Wednesday night, but the move remained a secret until yesterday.

"I really pulled a coup on this one, because no one in the press found out about it," Colin F. McGowen, builder of the house, said.
