## Krogh Is Out of Prison After Serving 4 Months

WASHINGTON, June 21 (UPI)—Egil Krogh Jr., former head of the White House "plumbers" investigating unit, was released today from Federal prison after serving four months and one week for his part in the Ellsberg break-in case.

Mr. Krogh was released from a detention facility at Fort Holabird outside Baltimore. He was transferred more than a week ago from the minimum-security Allenwood Federal prison farm near Lewisburg, Pa.

He immediately went to his home in Silver Spring, Md., and his lawyer said he was in seclusion with his wife, Suzanne, and two children.

Mr. Krogh pleaded guilty Nov. 30 to charges that he had violated the citizen's rights of Dr. Lewis J. Fielding, the Beverly Hills psychiatrist whose office was burglarized over Labor Day, 1971. Dr. Fielding had been treating Dr. Daniel Ellsberg, who had disclosed to reporters the secret Pentagon papers on the history of the Vietnam war.
