Time Out In Talks By the Sea

The two leaders spent the day in "intensive and extensive discussions," and spokesmen refused to disclose whether any progress had been made on limiting nuclear arms.

The talks—in Yalta, a place whose name Mr. Nixon helped to brand on the American consciousness in the 1950s as a symbol of misguided American statecraft because of the 1945 talks there—are being held in a calmer atmosphere than the two previous Nixon-Brezhnev summits.
