Report of Humphrey Probe

Senator Hubert H. Humphrey's 1968 and 1972 presidential campaign finances are being investigated by Watergate special prosecutor Leon Jaworski, CBS television said yesterday.

Sources in Jaworski's office said special emphasis was being placed on dairy contributions to the Minnesota Democrat, according to CBS.

A Senate Watergate committee report has said that Humphrey received more than \$200,000 from the same dairy sources that contributed to President Nixon's reelection campaign.

"You know, this is the largest dairy county in the U.S., right here, Wright county," Humphrey told CBS in an interview at his home in Waverly, Minn.

"For one to say that the contribution in the dairy cooperative to Hubert Humphrey was buying a bill or a vote would be the same thing as saying a contribution in Texas from an independent oil company was buying a vote," he said.

Humphrey also has been accused of accepting \$50,000 in cash from Howard Hughes in exchange for helping the billionaire industrialist stop underground nuclear testing in Nevada. He has denied receiping the money.
