Haldeman Asks Million for Book About His Years in White House

H. R. Haldeman, President Nixon's former chief of staff, is seeking \$1-million through an agent for rights to a book he is writing about his years in the White House.
At least five New York pub-lishing houses—Grosset & Dun-lap; Holt, Rinehart & Winston; Macmillan; Random House, and Simon & Schuster — are re-ported to have been approached about the book, which carries the working title "Inside."
Officials at Holt and at Simon & Schuster said the pro-jected work had been rejected; Macmillan and Random House declined to discuss the matter, and Grosset & Dunlap said they had asked to know more about the project.
