

Milk had 'cream' for HHH

WASHINGTON — The 1972 Presidential campaigns of Sen. Hubert Humphrey and Rep. Wilbur Mills were enriched by corporate contributions from milk cooperatives and other companies, according to the Senate Watergate Committee.

It said Humphrey received \$25,000 in corporate funds from Associated Milk Producers, Inc., an additional \$17,000 in Dairy Trust funds, \$10,000 in corporate funds from Minnesota Mining and Manufacturing Co., Inc., and contributions from Minneap-

olis businessman Dwayne Andreas and New York banker John L. Loeb Sr. in excess of the \$5,000 limit for individual contributions.

Mills got "up to \$75,000 from corporate assets of AMPI, \$15,000 from corporate assets of Mid-America Dairymen, Inc., and about \$40,000 in donations from members, employes and officials of AMPI, for a grand total of about \$185,000 from dairy producer sources." The report also said Mills received \$15,000 in Gulf Oil corporate funds and \$1,000 in SM Company funds.
