Nixon Says He'll Stay In Office

San Clemente

President Nixon declared last night that he will defeat the move to impeach him and serve out his full term.

In a long-distance telephone call to a dinner in Washington of the National Citizens Committee for Fairness to the Presidency, Mr. Nixon said: "Others will follow me in this office beginning in 1977 when I shall have finished."

His words were drowned out by thunderous applause from 2500 guests who attended the dinner, which was organized by Rabbi Baruch Korff, president of the committee.

The dinner was attended by Agriculture Secretary Earl L. Butz, Commerce Secretary Frederick Dent, Anne L. Armstrong, a presidential counselor, presidential consultant Patrick J. Buchanan and other officials.

Rabbi Korff formed the committee some months ago to solicit support for Mr. Nixon in the impeachment proceeding arising from the Watergate scandals.
