WXPost JUL 2 1 1974 Judge Tells Huston To List Targets

LOS ANGELES, July 23. (UPI) — At the request of actress Jane Fonda, a federal judge Tuesday ordered the former White House aide who gave his name to the "Huston Plan" to reveal the persons and groups that were the plan's targets.

The former aide, Tom Charles Huston, had recommended that President Nixon relax existing restraints against domestic intelligence operations, suggesting the use of "surreptious entry," wiretapping and mail surveillance of leftist groups. The "Huston Plan" was a major issue during impeachment hearings.

U.S. District Court Judge
Malcolm M. Lucas gave
Huston 30 days to provide
details of the 1970 White
House domestic intelligence
gathering operation, or refuse to do so on grounds of
executive privilege.

Miss Fonda, an activist against the Vietnam war, brought a \$2.8 million civil suit against the federal government, charging harassment by federal agencies directed by the White House.
