From proposed Articles of Impeachment, before the House Judiciary Committee:

He has abused his power to nominate and appoint the Attorney General of the United States by nonlinating and appointing an individual to that position who he knew had testified untruthfully under oath to a Senate Committee conducting hearings on his qualifications for office and by ratifying the untruthful testimony rather than reporting it to the Senate. \*

President: "I want something clearly understood. . . . The I.T.T. thing—stay the hell out of it. Is that clear? That's an order. . . . Don't file the brief."

Kleindienst: "Your order is not to file a brief?" President: "Your-my order is to drop the God damn thing. Is that clear?

Kleindienst: (laughs) "Yeah, I understand that." President: "Okay."
