

'War Crimes'

Protest at The Debate

Washington

A young man interrupted the House Judiciary Committee's impeachment inquiry yesterday by shouting, "Mr. Chairman, why isn't the President being impeached for war crimes — aren't war crimes as important as tapes?"

Committee Chairman Peter W. Rodino (Dem-N.J.) looked stunned and a moment later pounded his gavel saying: "Silence or you will have to leave the room."

A plainclothes detective moved toward the young man who had entered the room as part of a rotating group of the public.

A young woman also was escorted from the room.

Outside, they identified themselves as Sal Scafiei and Nancy Dorst and said they were from Baltimore and "of the Baltimore-Washington Nonviolence Community."
