The President Isn't Watching

President Nixon is confident that he will be vindicated when the full House of Representatives considers the articles of impeachment the Judiciary Committee has written against him, a White House spokesman said yesterday.

"Our belief is that the house will not vote out a bill of impeachment," deputy press secretary Gerald Warren said.

Warren said Mr. Nixon was not watching any of the Judiciary Committee proceedings on television but was receiving periodic reports.

Warren indicated that the President was devoting as little time as necessary to the impeachment matter and relying on aides, particularly chief of staff Alexander Haig Jr., to keep him posted on developments in Washington while he works at his residence and nearby office

Mr. Nixon is scheduled to end his two-week California vacation and return to Washington tomorrow.
