Judiciary Member's View

An Impeachment Prediction

Washington

Representative Edward Hutchinson (Rep-Mich.), ranking Republican on the House Judiciary Committee, predicted yesterday that the House will vote to impeach President Nixon.

In a broadcast interview, Hutchinson was asked about a House vote in light of Saturday night's 27-to-11 vote in favor of impeaching Mr.

Nixon for the Watergate coverup.

"I wouldn't at this point be willing to predict what the vote on the floor would be but I think the chances for the House to be actually

sending a bill of impeachment to the Senate appear to be quite — I think that is probably what will happen, but I wouldn't say by what margin."
