

Nixon's Aunt Says It's All Unfair

An 84-year-old aunt of President Nixon who taught him to play the piano as a boy thinks the impeachment proceedings against her nephew are "unfair and a disgrace."

Jane Beeson, longtime resident of this community, described the proceedings as "very prejudiced and one-sided."

"I can't help feeling that the Democrats were so upset about the way the last election went they are bound to put him down if it is possible," she said.

Mrs. Beeson has taught piano for nearly six decades.

Mr. Nixon spent some time with her and her late husband as a boy of 12 when he learned to play the piano.

Mrs. Beeson has refused to watch the televised impeachment proceedings.

"I wonder, isn't there any champion for Richard in this whole country?" she said. "I'm not saying he is perfect, no one is. But I think he has had the highest of motives in all that he has done for this country."

Mrs. Beeson, who attended Mr. Nixon's 1972 inauguration, said she writes the President frequently and he always answers her.
