

House Given Schedule To Listen to Tapes

WASHINGTON, Aug. 2 (UPI)—A schedule for listening to 19 taped White House conversations was distributed to all 435 members of the House today by the House Judiciary Committee at the direction of its chairman, Representative Peter N. Rodino Jr., Republican of New Jersey.

Four rooms have been equipped with a total of 204 tables and sets of earphones to accommodate all Representatives who want to hear that evidence for themselves.

The schedule begins at 8:30 A.M. Monday, with the playing of the June 20, 1972, dictabelt on which Mr. Nixon summarized his activities for that day, three days after the Watergate break-in. It ends Friday with the March 21, 1973, conversations concerning payments to the defendants.
