Time magazine said yesterday that a five-minute, 12-second gap in a White House tape of a conversation between President Nixon and his top aides resulted from the end of one reel and the beginning of a new one being clipped.

1973, conversation involving more than one minute was Mr. Nixon and aides John Ehrlichman and H.R. Haldeman was one of 30 turned over to Judge John J. Sirica last week following a Supreme Court ruling.
