

**62% IN N.B.C. POLL
FOR IMPEACHMENT**

A National Broadcasting Company news poll, begun on July 31 and completed over the weekend, showed that 62 per cent of those questioned favored impeaching President Nixon, with 50 per cent favoring his removal from office if impeached.

Thirty-one per cent opposed impeachment, with 7 per cent undecided, while 37 per cent were against removal from office after impeachment, with 13 per cent not sure.

Fifty-five per cent of those interviewed said Mr. Nixon should resign if impeached, with 38 per cent opposed and 7 per cent uncertain.

At least two-thirds of those polled agreed with all three articles of impeachment — 68 per cent each in favor of the articles covering obstruction of justice and abuse of powers, and 66 per cent agreeing with the third article covering defiance of subpoenas.

The poll, conducted by telephone nationwide was based on a scientifically selected sample of 1,555 persons.
