

The last of the subpoenaed White House tapes has been delivered to Federal Judge John Sirica. Correspondent David Schoumacher has details at the District Court in Washington.

Schoumacher: The President's lawyers made their final delivery of tapes this afternoon, and according to James St. Clair nine are missing or were never recorded. According to the White House seven of the conversations took place either in the President's living quarters or at Camp David, away from the secret taping system.

Two key conversations, however, have mysteriously disappeared - both between the President and his chief of staff, H.R. Haldeman. In one the two men apparently discussed Howard Hunt's alleged blackmail demands; in the other they reportedly talked about finding a high federal job for Jeb Magruder, one that would not require Senate confirmation, even though Magruder by then had admitted he perjured himself trying to cover up the re-election committee's connection with Watergate.
