Caller to KGO talk show (Owen Spann) reads the following quotation from a speech by Sen. Richard Nixon in Boston, 29 May, 1951:

"We have had corruption in our history, but never before in our history have we seen corruption defended and condoned by those in high places. If they won't recognize or admit that corruption exists, how can we expect them to clean it out? Our greatest responsibility is to restore again the moral integrity of our national government.

And let me say this: that wherever we find immorality or a er a breach of public trust, those who are guilty should be removed. We shall restore again the faith of the people in the honesty, morality and integrity of their government officials, and we shall set an example for all the world to see of the heights free men can reach in governing themselves."
