I think there's another element here. I think - I talked to a psychologist last night after the President's [resignation] speech, a friend of mine named Stanley Shelburne [Sheldon?], Cambridge. He sees - and I think a lot of psychologists see - President Nixon, as he put it, as a massive chronic paranoic, unable to look at what he himself has done. He didn't mention the word impeachment in the speech, and so on. I think, though, as this thing goes on a little further, I think this is going to be a book case for the psychologists. But it's also going to be something in the criminal area, and I think they're going to look at it.
