

**'Impeachment Trial Urged
By Nixon's 1950 Opponent**

FAIRLEE, Vt., Aug. 8 (UPI) — Helen Gahagan Douglas, whose political career was cut short by Richard Nixon in 1950, said today that she was sorry the impeachment process had not proceeded to its logical conclusion in the Senate.

Mrs. Douglas, the wife of Melvin Douglas, the actor, lost the 1950 senate race in California to Mr. Nixon, who was chosen two years later

by General of the Army Dwight D. Eisenhower as his running mate. The Nixon-Douglas campaign was one of the most bitter in California history, with Mr. Nixon attempting to link his Democratic opponent to Communist causes.

Mrs. Douglas said an impeachment trial in the Senate, "would have educated us as to what a President can do and cannot do; what a Congress must do and must not give up; if we are to retain our freedom."
