

'VOTERS' SUE NIXON TO GET \$25-MILLION

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 9 (UPI)

—Two hours after Richard M. Nixon left office today, he was named a defendant in a \$25-million damage suit seeking to void results of the 1972 Presidential election on grounds of "fraud and corruption."

The complaint was filed in United States District Court on behalf of "American voters" by Kent Saldan, 35 years old, who said he was chairman of the American Constitutional Rights Committee here. The complaint indicated that any award would be "divided equally among all voters who file for it within one year after the judgment."

—The nation's largest dairy co-op has sued Mr. Nixon's campaign trust for return of \$100,000 given illegally in 1969, one of the co-op's lawyers said today.

Associated Milk Producers, Inc., sued in United States District Court after months of trying to get the money refunded voluntarily, according to the lawyer, Sidney Harris.
