

Rebozo and Abplanalp Visit Nixon

San Clemente

Former President Richard Nixon stayed inside the grounds of his oceanside estate yesterday and talked with his closest friends and financial confidants, Charles Rebozo and Robert Abplanalp. *11 AUG*

The two, who also met Saturday with Mr. Nixon, said the former President "seems fine and is not upset." *10 AUG*

Rebozo and Abplanalp had lunch in a restaurant before going to the Nixon estate.

They appeared subdued and declined to characterize the former President further or to describe specifically their conversations with him during the weekend.

"We're out here as friends to do what we can — that's all," Abplanalp said.

"Anything more than we said now would not be appropriate," he added.

Abplanalp said he and Rebozo, who have in the past been deeply involved in Mr. Nixon's financial affairs, both arrived Friday night.

The two businessmen spoke briefly with a few reporters after lunch and then left quickly in a car, saying they were late for their meeting with Mr. Nixon.

Mr. Nixon and his family remained at the estate yesterday and did not go out, even to church. He, his wife Pat, daughter Tricia and her husband Edward Cox, arrived at San Clemente Friday following his resignation from office. *9 AUG*

A member of the former president's staff said Mr. Nixon spent yesterday morning with his family and then walked to his office in another building and worked for more than an hour before returning for lunch and his meeting with Rebozo and Abplanalp.
