A special Senate committee has concluded that many of the most significant presidential decisions have been with-held from the Congress and the public.

In a report yesterday, the panel said the practice that has permitted the withholding has hidden actions relating to the 1969-70 secret U.S. bombing of Cambodia, as well as other matters relating to the Vietnam war. Vietnam war.

The report by the Special Committee on National Emergencies is scheduled to be issued later this week, along with proposed legislation to tighten the laws that have permitted the withhelding mitted the withholding.

In the report, it said the gap in the public record "is primarily due to a failure by Congress to sepcify substantive standards under which all be recorded."

"In addition," it adds,
"Congress has not yet enacted
laws which would prevent the
executive from using classification to withhold information
from Congress and the public.
"Until Congress grapples
with these issues directly it
will be faced with a continuing veil of secrecy and be unable to carry out its constitutional task of overseeing the
executive, the report continues, declaring:
"The Indochina War and
Watergate tragically illustrate
the results of such congressional inattention."
