

Watergate Aide to Colson's Old Firm

One of the original Watergate prosecutors is leaving his job to join a Washington law firm in which Charles W. Colson was a senior partner.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Seymour Glanzer will join the firm of Dickstein, Shapiro and Morrin about November 1 as a senior partner, David I. Shapiro, one of the partners confirmed Monday.

When Colson resigned as special presidential counsel in the spring of 1973 he and Shapiro formed the firm of Colson and Shapiro.

Colson left the firm after being indicted in the Watergate coverup and Ellsberg burglary cases last spring. He is currently serving a one year sentence after pleading guilty in the coverup.
