Before he resigned as president last week, Richard M. Nixon ordered his aides not to seek any deals preventing his future prosecution, the Baltimore Son says.

Quoting what it called authoritative sources, the Sun said in a story in yesterday's editions that Mr. Nixon ordered his key aides, even before his final decision to resign, to make no approaches to Congress for lenient treatment.

The Sun also said it was told that the subject of immunity for Mr. Nixon was not discussed when White House Chief of Staff Alexander M. Haig Jr. visited special prosecutor Leon Jawerski shortly after then-Vice President Ford was informed of Mr. Nixon's decision to quit.
