Impeach Report to House

Washington

The House will be asked today to accept its Judiciary Committee's report on the impeachment case against former President Nixon and order it printed as a House document.

After consultation among leaders of both parties, a carefully worded resolution was drafted avoiding language that could be taken as puting the House on record with an indirect impeachment yote.

House majority leader Thomas P. O'Neill Jr. (Dem-Mass.) announced he will introduce the resolution and the House will take it up under a procedure requiring a two-thirds vote.

The draft resolution says the House "takes notice" that it authorized the impeachment inquiry, that the committee voted articles of impeachment and that Mr. Nixon resigned.

It says the House "accepts the report," orders it printed, and "commends the chairman and the other members of the committee . . . for their conscientious and capable efforts . . ."
