Krogh Is Offered State Job in Seattle

SEATTLE, Aug. 21 (AP) —Egil ('Bud') Krogh, who led the White House "plumbers" investigative unit, has been offered a job in the Washington state attorney general's office.

Meanwhile, a disciplinary panel of the Washington Bar Association recommended today that Krogh be suspended from practice of law for nine months. The recommendation, if approved, will go to the state Supreme Court for a final decision.

Krogh pleaded guilty last Nov. 30 to a felony charge in connection with the "plumbers." He was released from federal prison earlier this year, but was suspended from the practice of law in Washington.

Attorney General Slade Gorton told the bar committee that he would hire Krogh as an assistant attorney general if possible and as a legal intern if he is barred from practice of law.
