

Rebozo Lawyers Rebuffed

A judge ordered yesterday that Charles G. Rebozo's lawyers must turn over to special prosecutor Leon Jaworski financial documents relating to Rebozo's alleged use of campaign funds for improvements on Richard M. Nixon's home and to buy diamond earrings for Mrs. Nixon.

The lawyers, Thomas H. Wakefield, Robert Hewett

and Garth Webster of Miami, had insisted the documents were protected by the attorney-client relationship. But U.S. District Judge George L. Hart Jr., conducting an hour-long hearing in open court and in his chambers, said only legal matters, but not business deals, were protected by such a relationship.

Assistant prosecutor Paul R. Michel revealed in court

documents Monday that a grand jury is investigating whether Rebozo illegally diverted campaign funds to pay for \$36,000 in improvements to Mr. Nixon's Key Biscayne home and \$5000 for the earrings.

Hart ruled that the subpoenas for documents "as to the cash deposits and the expenditures made therefrom" must be enforced.
