

Another Subpoena For Nixon

Charlotte, N.C.

Former President Richard Nixon will be subpoenaed to answer questions next month in Santa Ana, Calif., about security measures taken in his behalf during a 1971 visit here.

George S. Daly Jr., attorney for 21 persons who contend they were illegally barred from a Nixon speech at Billy Graham Day observances, said he has filed notice to take Mr. Nixon's deposition at 10 a.m. September 24.

The plaintiffs, mostly young anti-war protesters, are suing former White House aide H. R. Haldeman and two Nixon advance men for \$1.3 million.

They contend they were illegally prevented from entering the Charlotte Coliseum where Mr. Nixon spoke to a friendly crowd of 12,000 persons.

Haldeman appeared here Thursday (to give a deposition in the case.

The subpoena, filed in U.S. District Court Thursday, orders Mr. Nixon to "bring with you all documents, tapes, recordings, notes, papers or like things relating to the visit of Richard M. Nixon to Charlotte, North Carolina, on Oct. 15, 1971. . . ."

The deposition will be taken at an attorney's office in Santa Ana, Daly said.
