James W. McCord Jr., one of the men convicted in the Watergate break-in has subpoenaed Presidential tapes for use in his civil lawsuit.

The subpoena, field in United States District Court yesterday, calls on the White House counsel, Philip W. Buchen, to deliver all tapes made between Jan, 1 and Jan. 31, 1973.

The Watergate trial began that Jan. 8 and ended Jan. 30 with the conviction of Mr. McCord, a former employe of the Committee for the Re-election of the President, and G. Gordon Liddy, a former White House aide. Five other men charged with them pleaded guilty.

This is the second subpoena directed to Mr. Buchen in the last week calling for the tapes of former President Richard M. Nixon. The first was filed by R. Spencer Oliver, fromer executive director of the Association of State Democratic Chairmen, who also has a Watergate suit pending.
