Told to Follow Law on Nixon

BOSTON, Aug. 30 (UPI)—Former Attorney General Elliot L. Richardson said today that Watergate Special Prosecutor Leon Jaworski should consider legal action against former President Nixon on the "requirements of law alone."

At a news conference to endorse Gov. Francis W. Sargent for re-election Richardson said the cases of Mr. Nixon and former Vice President Spiro T. Agnew were quite different.

He said his decision to let Agnew plead no contest to tax evasion charges was based on Agnew's intention to seek a full trial.

In the case of Mr. Nixon, Richardson said, "He [Jaworski] should view the whole matter with the requirements of law alone."

Richardson served as Mr. Nixon's Secretary of Defense and Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare as well as Attorney General.

He resigned as Attorney General when then President Nixon fired Archibald Cox as special prosecutor in October, 1973.
