Western Union's regional office in Reno — the office that handles telegrams phoned in from eight western states — was deluged with wires for the White House yesterday. It began receiving them shortly after President Ford announced he was pardoning former President Nixon.

Warren Kreiger, Western Union's operations manager here, wouldn't a divulge the actual numbers of telegrams, but he said:

"The phones have been ringing constantly since about 8:15 a.m. We're up about 150 per cent over a normal Sunday. We usually have fewer than 25 people working on Sunday. We've had more than 50 here today, including all the management personnel."

Kreiger said, most of the

telegrams were from California. The office also serves Nevada, Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Wyoming, Utah and Arizona.

Kreiger wouldn't discuss the tone of the messages.

"There is a definite tone," he said, "but we are absolutely forbidden to say what it is."

Another Western Union source, however, said in San Francisco that the first 14 telegrams received yesterday were "irate." Our Correspondent
