



McCloskey's Advice

Representative Pete McCloskey (Rep-Menlo Park) yesterday urged President Ford not to grant any further pardons and called on him to turn over to Congress all Watergate materials.

In a letter to the White House, McCloskey said he

felt Mr. Ford had made a "serious mistake" in granting a pardon to the former President.

"To pardon Mr. Nixon and also to turn over to him the Watergate tapes without full public scrutiny cannot help but enhance present public

suspicious that the Ford administration has joined in the Watergate coverup," McCloskey said.

Meanwhile, at his daily press conference yesterday, San Mateo County District Attorney Keith Sorenson attacked President Ford's pardon as unconstitutional.
