

Krogh Thinks Blanket Pardon Not the Answer

Former White House aide Egil Krogh, who served 4½ months for a Watergate offense, said yesterday that a pardon for the remaining defendants would be a mistake.

Krogh pleaded guilty Nov. 30, 1973, to one count of violating the rights of Dr. Lewis Fielding, then Daniel Ellsberg's psychiatrist,

"It was the right thing for me to plead guilty," he said. "It was the right thing for me to serve. Pardon would have aborted that process."
