Former White House chief Court does not begin its fall of staff H. R. (Bob) Haldeman term until Oct. 7. yesterday carried his hopes for a delay in the Watergate cover-up trial to the U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals here.

The Court of Appeals also has before it a petition by former White House aide Gordon Strachan, another defendant in the cover-up case, to force dismissal of the charges against him on the grounds that the government's evidence was tainted.
