uments which show some of the price differences the taxpayers have underwritten. In Fort Lee, N.J., for instance, a private con-tractor charges \$3.50 for a gas-line filter that is available for \$8 cents in government mainte-nance centers.

A battery in Teaneck, N.J., set the taxpayers back \$44.90. The same battery costs only \$17.86 in government garages. The taxpayers also got stuck with a \$58 which were available at government garages for \$4.12.
