

Korff Unit Renamed

A group originally organized to fight impeachment proceedings against Richard M. Nixon took another name yesterday and said it would now promote a wide range of conservative causes.

Bruce Herschensohn, a former Nixon aide and frequent critic of the news media, will be executive director of the organization while Rabbi Baruch Korff remains as its president. Herschensohn left his \$36,000 White House post Saturday.

The group, formerly called the National Citizens' Commit-

tee for Fairness to the Presidency, is now titled the United States Citizens' Congress.

Herschensohn claimed a membership of more than 2½ million. But he did not argue when a reporter asked if that figure included people who merely had signed a petition backing Mr. Nixon.

A written statement by Korff, now on a tour of Israel, said that the USCC "will actively lobby in the halls of Congress for whatever measures will strengthen the people's control of their own government."

Herschensohn, meanwhile, said that the first objective is to bring balance and humanity to the irresponsibility of particular news organizations." He mentioned only CBS and NBC by name.

In one month's time," he said, "we have seen President Ford given higher praise for taking his English muffins out of the toaster than they had given President Nixon for bringing our prisoners of war out of captivity."
