

Jaworski Report May Omit Nixon

Special prosecutor Leon Jaworski said yesterday it is unlikely his final report will describe Richard M. Nixon's role in the Watergate scandal.

Jaworski said in a letter to eight senators that he does not have legal authority to include Mr. Nixon's actions in his final report.

"It is our tentative belief that the existing authority for the issuance of reports most likely does not justify the inclusion of a detailed report on . . . the involvement of the former President in matters under our investigation," Jaworski said.

The Senators had earlier urged Jaworski to include a complete report on Mr. Nixon's Watergate role.

President Ford, in explaining his pardon of Mr. Nixon, said Monday the fact the House Judiciary Committee concluded Mr. Nixon was guilty of impeachable offenses "is very persuasive evidence."

Mr. Ford also said some of this evidence had been developed by Jaworski and that he expected it to be included in the prosecutor's report.
