A trust established by the National Committee for Fairness to the Presidency already has paid \$30,000 of Richard Nixon's legal expenses, the chairman of the committee said last night.

Rabbi Baruch Korff, a vocal supporter of Mr. Nixon both before and after he left office, said in an interview that the former President has amassed \$155,000 in lawyers' bills since resigning.

Korff said he was serving as a trustee of the fund, along with Jack McLaughlin, a Nixon supporter from Baltimore, and Bruce Herschensohn, a former Nixon aide who lives in Washington, D.C.

The rabbi said he contributed the first \$1000 to the fund and the committee he heads loaned the trust \$30,-000.
