forced to quit

BOSTON — Dr. John McLaughlin was ordered by his Jesuit superior to quit his post as a White House aide, an official Jesuit newspaper says.

SJ News, a publication of the Society of Jesus of New England, reported in its October issue that "reliable Jesuit sources" said Dr. McLaughlin had received a letter from the Rev. Richard Cleary, the New England provincial, ordering him to resign.

Dr. McLaughlin served as an adviser to former President Nixon and stayed on at the White House after Nixon was succeeded by Gerald R. Ford. His resignation becomes effective Tuesday.
