Richard M. Nixon's doctor said yesterday that a weekend examination of the former President turned up "no clinical evidence of reactivation" of the painful phlebitis which hospitalized him for 11 days.

Dr. John Lungren said Mr. Nixon is still in a period of "controlled physical activity," indicating that at least for the immediate future, he would not be available for testimony in the Watergate coverup trial in Washington.

Lungren said Mr. Nixon's lower left leg is still swollen but not tender.

"His anticoagulant therapy is proceeding satisfactorily to date without complications," Lungren said.

He said he examined Mr. Nixon "this weekend at San Clemente."
