Haig, former White House chief of staff who was recently named supreme allied commander in Europe, was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross (DSC) for heroism as a battalion commander during the battle of Ap guent during the battle of Ap gu on March 31 and April 1, 1967.

He also was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross (DFC) for actions as a brigade

He recommended Haig for the DSC "as a result of his ex-traordinary heroism in com-mand of the first 26th Infan-try" on the morning of April 1, Hollingsworth said.

In a statement Sunday night, Lt. Gen. James Hollings-worth said he was responsible for recommending both awards. At the time, he said, he was assistant division com-

Hollingsworth's statement

said Haig was airborne over the battle most of the after-noon of March 31 and that his
