NEW ORLEANS, Oct. 16, (AP)—Attorney General Wil-liam B. Saxbe said today that deputy Watergate Special Prosecutor Henry S. Ruth Jr. is the leading contender for is the leading contender for the nomination to replace Spe-cial Prosecutor Leon Jaworski.

The Attorney General said the will decide early next week on his recommendation for a Successor to Jaworski, who has submitted his resignation ef-fective Oct. 25 after nearly a year in charge of the Watergate prosecution force.

In response to questions at a news conference, Saxbe said he couldn't say whether others are being considered for the nomination, because he has not yet given it his full atten-tion. He said he probably will confer with President Ford on
