California High Court Rejects Kalmbach Bid

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 17
(AP)—The California Supreme
Court turned down Thursday a
request by Herbert W. Kalmbach to lift his interim suspension from law practice.

It also denied former President Richard M. Nixon's personal attorney a hearing on
whether moral turpitude was
involved in his conviction on
a charge of promising a European ambassadorship in return for a \$100,000 political
contribution.

The court referred the matter back to the California
State Bar Association to
make a feport and recommend to the court what discipline should be imposed for
the ambassadorship incident.

The bar was also asked to
determine whether moral turpitude was involved in Mr.
Kalmbach's conviction on a
second charge of accepting
\$3.9-million in campaign contributions for an illegally organized political committee.

Mr. Kalmbach, 52 years
old, of Newport Beach, pleaded guilty Feb. 25 and began
serving a six-to-18-month
Federal prison term July 1.
